IS A WORLD WHERE ALL WHO PARTICIPATE IN RESEARCH, SCHOLARSHIP, AND INNOVATION ARE UNIQUELY IDENTIFIED AND CONNECTED TO THEIR CONTRIBUTIONS AND AFFILIATIONS ACROSS TIME, DISCIPLINES, AND BORDERS.



WHAT IS ORCID?

- A persistent identifier for researchers
- A registry
- A set of standard procedures (APIs) for connecting researchers to their affiliations and activities
 A committed community building connectors
 An international-scale open research effort



Data in research evaluation



Research evaluation is hampered by a lack of data that clearly connect a research program with its outcomes and, in particular, by ambiguity (neskaidrība?) about who has participated in the program and what contributions they have made.




